Five tips to help you take great photos of your project

- 1. Focus on small groups of people with them all facing the camera—no backs!

 Zoom in to also show a focus on a visual feature of your project, like a compost bin, garden bed, beehive, frog pond, nesting box, etc.
- Get everyone to pose with their tools, plants, watering cans, etc., to look at the camera with big smiles!
- Make sure it isn't too sunny as this can cast shadows. For best results, have the sun behind your subjects.
- The zoom on smart phones can make the picture blurry, so get up close to avoid using the zoom.
- eNewsletters and social media don't require high-resolution images. However, if you are going to use an image in something that will be printed, ideally your photos should be at least 1MB.
