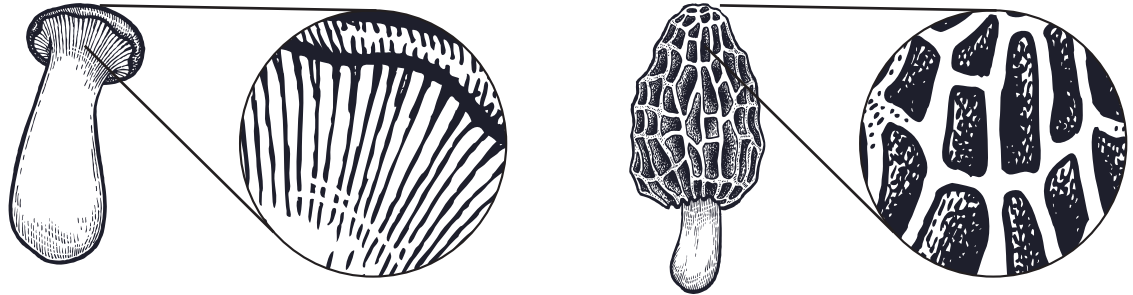




Scientific drawing in focus

When scientists want to add detail to a scientific drawing subject, they create a separate labelled illustration. This illustration magnifies the subject so that you can see it close-up and identify the key features. Scientists use two lines that lead from the magnified drawing to show where on the subject this detail is found.

Examples:
