Tips for sharing your Victorian Junior Landcare and Biodiversity Grants story

With so many fantastic Victorian Junior Landcare and Biodiversity Grants projects happening, we'd love to help you share your stories to inspire other young people to get involved in helping our environment! Here are our five top tips for getting your story out.

1. Chat to your local media

We encourage you to share your good local news stories with your local media. You could do this when you receive your grant or wait a few months until the project is in progress and let the media know how it's progressing.

We've included a media release template in this resource kit to make it super easy for you to share your good news story with your local newspaper, radio or TV station. Simply find contact details for your local media outlets, add information about your project to the media release, and send it off. Remember to include a great photo for a better chance of scoring an article in the local paper.

2. Get snap happy

When it comes to promoting projects, a picture really does paint a thousand words. You don't need a fancy camera to take great photos – a smartphone will do. Here are some tips:

- Focus on small groups of people with them all facing the camera—no backs!
- Get everyone to pose with their tools or plants to look at the camera with big smiles!
- Make sure it isn't too sunny as this can cast shadows. For best results, have the sun
- behind your subjects.
- The zoom on smart phones can make the picture blurry, so get up close to avoid using
 the zoom.
- Ideally your photos should be at least 1MB to be usable in print, if you want to submit to your local newspaper.

3. Don't forget to get social

Promote your project on your social media channels with your great photos to give project updates. Be sure to use #juniorlandcare and please tag Landcare Australia and the Victorian Government's Department of Energy, Environment and Climate Action (DEECA):
